

Etna Cowl

This cowl is cabled to give it a fun textured look, and knit with two different yarns at once for unique color. It is knitted with large needles so it is nice and cozy as well as a quick knit.

This project requires intermediate knitting knowledge (casting on, knit stitch, purl stitch, and three needle bind off) making it a great project for any knitter who wants an easy project with little detail work. The cabling doesn't use a cable needle, instead a third knitting needle is used.

Materials:

- 1 skein each of Vanna's Choice yarn in "Linen" and "Wheat"
- Size 17 knitting needles
- 1 extra large knitting needle (I used an extra size 17)

To Make:

Cast on 20 stitches.

Work in Stockinette stitch for 14 rows

Cable row: Slip the first 5 stitches onto third needle and hold in back of work, knit next 5 stitches off of left needle, knit the 5 stitches on extra needle. Slip 5 stitches onto extra needle and hold in front of work, knit next 5 stitches off of left needle, knit the 5 stitches on extra needle.

Next row: purl

Work in Stockinette stitch for 14 rows. Repeat cable row. Repeat this pattern until piece is about 5 ½ - 6 feet long (or will comfortably wrap around your neck twice).

Using the three needle bind off method, bind off work to connect cowl.
